February 25–April 11 LENT. In penitence and contrition we bring before God the brokenness and evil in our lives, asking for God's forgiveness and healing. Appropriate colors are VIOLET, with Holy Week as follows: VIOLET for Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday; WHITE for Maundy Thursday; RED or BLACK for Good Friday; WHITE for Easter Sunday.

AFRICAN AMERICAN HISTORY MONTH. Noted African American scholar Carter G. Woodson initiated "Negro History Week" in 1926 as a way to study the achievements of African Americans who had been omitted from history books.
